Message from Pastor

As several of our youth get ready to Affirm their Baptism in their confirmation service in October, they like us are asked these questions;

Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism:

to live among God's faithful people,

to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,

to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,

to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,

and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

This month we'll focus on the first promise of the baptismal covenant to live among God's people. It is a promise to participate in the Body of Christ. But what does it mean to "live among God's faithful people?" The picture that best describes this is found in Acts 2:42. We hear that the new followers of Christ "devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." There is a Greek word in that sentence that deserves closer study, Koinoia. The word "koinonia" in the New Testament is the gift of the Holy Spirit to the church. It refers first to the relationship we have with God through the Spirit and then to the relationships we have with each other through the Spirit. It refers to the oneness or unity we have in Jesus Christ who prayed for his followers, that they would be one just as He and the Father were one. This unity is a gift of the Spirit, and we encourage it as we form ourselves as a Family of Christ.

What does it mean to live among God's faithful people? Well according to Acts it means that we are in the Word together, learning and practicing the life Jesus taught. We are to coming together in fellowship. We are to meet together wherever we do life. We are to help and support each other. We are to worship and pray together being transformed. We are to share our resources for the benefit of others. All of this because the Spirit of God is noticeable in this community, and there is a magnetism that is drawing other people to God through us.

That is a beautiful picture of what it means to live among God's faithful people. We are living in this kind of faith community here at Family of Christ, and I give thanks to God, because this community is a gift to all of us.

Rally Sunday was held as the young ones were able to see their classrooms,


meet teachers, and help decorate their rooms.

In English, the phrase means 'shoulder to shoulder' and describes the way in which we accompany one another in a spirit of mutuality, inclusivity, and vulnerability. Through the work of this partnership and the leading of God's Holy Spirit, we envision deeper faith and fuller life, accompanying one another as participants in God's ongoing mission in both America and Tanzania.

Our partnership supports the Illula congregation, secondary school students, medical school scholarship, Dignity for Daughters, and Iringa Hope micro financing.

Tanzania Sunday- October 5th

Come join the celebration & learn more about Family of Christ's Tanzania Ministries including: our Usokami Partnership, Secondary Student Scholarships, Medical Scholarships, Dignity for Daughters, and Iringa Hope Microfinance.

We will also see memories of our trip to Tanzania last November.

Secondary Student Scholarships

Since 2004, Family of Christ members and friends have sponsored 415 Usokami secondary students. During the current school year there are a total of fourteen Usokami secondary school age students shown on the Bega Kwa Bega report including six boys and eight girls. Providing scholarship support for these students is a great investment toward a brighter future for them, their community, Tanzania, and Africa. FOC sponsored students will be attending Lutheran private schools. These schools are owned by the ELCA of Tanzania and have a good environment for study as the students are living away from home and can concentrate on their studies.

The 2026 FOC scholarship goal is again to raise \$8400.

The cost of room, board and education for an entire year is \$615. Any size donation will help reach the \$8400 financial goal and is such a generous gift.

Scholarship donations are due by October 26.



Iringa Hope Micro-Finance Project

In 2019 We began to partner with Iringa Hope, an organization that raises funds and administrates microfinance loans. **Iringa Hope** uses a unique model to deliver agricultural financing, marketing, and training to smallholder farmers in Tanzania. The organization develops self-governed and self-sustaining member owned and operated cooperative societies that help to alleviate poverty and empower entrepreneurs. Microfinance loans are made to small businesses and farms with an average loan of \$300. The repayment rate of the loans is 98% so our donations continue to be loaned out year after year.

Medical Scholarship

The Tanzania Medical Scholarship team is sponsoring two medical students:

- Justice Bwisco who is in his 4th year of radiography training at Makerere University in Uganda and will return to the Ilula Hospital after completion of his studies.
- Magreth Mgeyekwa starting a Bachelor of Science in Midwifery.

To help support these medical scholarships, a craft sale will be held after church on Tanzania Sunday, October 5. Stop by and purchase some of our unique, one-of-a-kind craft items. The Medical Scholarship team will also participate in other area craft fairs.
